## **Yancey Parker Industrial Park - Phase II receives AdvantageSite designation**

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Oct. 9th – Yancey Parker Industrial Park—Phase II has received an AdvantageSite designation.

The AdvantageSite program requires that community economic development organizations provide documentation specific to a proposed industrial site, including a set of standard data related to ownership/control, environmental and geotechnical conditions, and infrastructure status.

Sites must also meet size, zoning and accessibility requirements.

“The AdvantageSite designation demonstrates the serious commitment to economic development shared by the City of Enterprise and the City of Enterprise Industrial Board,” said Enterprise Mayor Kenneth W. Boswell. “We are committed to taking the steps necessary to expedite and simplify the prospect’s decision making process.”

“The goal in economic development site searches is to ‘stay on the list’ and be the last site on the prospect’s list,” said Frank Thompson, Executive Director of the Enterprise Coffee Geneva Economic Development Corp. “This distinction for the Yancey Parker Industrial Park – Phase II is an important factor in staying on the prospect’s list.”

“Yancey Parker Industrial Park—Phase II joins a growing inventory of quality sites that have earned the AdvantageSite designation,” said Greg Knighton, Economic Development Partnership of Alabama vice president and director of business information. “These sites are being actively marketed on the web-based Alabama Buildings and Sites database, which averages 630 daily searches.”

The AdvantageSite program is jointly sponsored by the Alabama Development Office, Alabama Gas Corporation, Alabama Power Company, EDPA, the North Alabama Industrial Development Association and PowerSouth Energy Cooperative.

The voluntary industrial site preparedness program was created in order to make the state more competitive for companies considering a location in Alabama.
